**FROM THE RECTOR**

Two months ago the Vestry and Clergy made a special appeal for increased financial support for St. Mary's Church. The reality is that our levels of giving have not kept up with the rising costs of operation. In recent years the Vestry has simply supplemented the operating budget from trust income. With the mortgage payments due on the new addition that will not be so easy to do.

It has been very gratifying to see how the members of this parish have answered that plea. By the end of March just over half of our households have responded either to restate their original pledge or to increase it. The amount of increased giving to the work of the parish stands at just under \$25,000. This will make budgeting and operations much easier in the coming year. I thank you for your faithful responses.

Let me also mention here a related topic. In the days after our parish meeting and the sending of information to those who had not attended, I heard some concerns and surprise about the amount of my compensation. When taken all together the various components of my compensation add up to over \$100,000. Trust me, that does not mean that I make \$100,000! Following is a breakdown of my compensation package. This information is also available on the copy of the annual budget which is always posted on a parish hall bulletin board.

My compensation as Rector of St. Mary's is \$59,633 annually. (That amount has not increased since 2009.) To offset self-employment taxes payable on the value of supplied housing and utilities I receive an annual tax payment of \$10,771. To offset the loss of equity in a home which comes as a result of living in the rectory an annual deposit of \$5,000 is made into an account which will be disbursed at the end of my service to St. Mary's. The Church Pension Fund assesses a pension payment of \$18,500 annually and I am allowed \$2,500 annually for continuing education. The final component of my compensation is the medical insurance, mandated by the National Episcopal Church, which comes at a cost of over \$30,000 a year.

Full time rectors are often the single largest item in the budget of a small congregation. The minimum compensation in this diocese for a priest just out of seminary with no parish experience is just under \$45,000. When the mandatory pension and insurance are added a full time clergy person becomes out of reach for many smaller congregations. This is why many congregations are now looking for part time or bi-vocational pastors.

I hope this information will be helpful to you. And, again, on behalf of the Vestry and myself, thank you for your faithful financial support of the work of this community.

## Holy Week and Easter Services

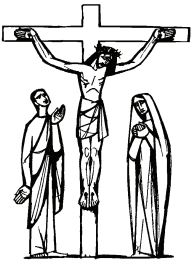


The services of Holy Week and Easter, as they are kept by traditional liturgical churches are the high points of the liturgical year. These days tell, in concentrated form, the substance of our faith.

The service on **Maundy Thursday (April 21 at 7:30 pm)** commemorates the institution of the Lord's Supper and the imperative command Our Lord gives his followers to serve others. This command is symbolized by the traditional ceremony of the Washing of Feet. Following the service proper there is an Agape meal which is a simple time of table fellowship around bread, wine and fruit. It celebrates the community of love (in Greek: *agape*) into which Jesus calls us and fortifies us for the solemn fast of the next day. Continuing on into the night is the traditional watch before the Sacrament. Jesus asks: "Can you now watch with me for one hour?" And so some of us will do just that.



On **Good Friday (April 22)** the **Noonday** service will be the Stations of the Cross which we will again share with our brothers and sisters from St. Eugene, St. Mark's Lutheran, and St. Paul's United Methodist. This year the people of First Presbyterian will join our observance. At **7:30 pm** the evening service will include the Veneration of the Cross during which we are each invited to come and "lay our burdens" on the Cross. Good Friday is one of the two fasting days of the Church. All those who are able are expected to limit their food to two half meals and one simple (meatless) meal following the last service of the day. The fast does not apply to those under 16 years of age, the infirm, those who do not choose their own food, or to those who by virtue of their employment must keep physically robust. It is normative that those in these categories find another way to honor the spirit of the fast.



The celebration of **the Resurrection** begins at sundown on Saturday with **The Great Vigil of Easter (April 23 at 7:30 pm)**. The service begins in darkness and we hear the story of God's acts of salvation and faithfulness to the Chosen People. This story culminates in the first proclamation of Jesus' Resurrection. This is the primary Easter celebration in this parish and is followed by a festive breaking of the Lenten fast. All are invited to bring their favorite treat to share.



For those who cannot attend the Vigil there will be services at **8:00 am** and **11:00 am** on **Easter Day (April 24)**.

## ADULT FORUM IN APRIL

We will continue our exploration of bread and wine on the first two Sundays of April, ending with a decision about which of the breads we have baked we want to begin using for communion. On Palm Sunday, as we have done in years past, we will use the Adult Forum time to look at the liturgies for the upcoming services of Holy Week. The services of Holy Week are the high point of the church year and are different than the regular Sunday Mass. This is an especially good time for people new to the Episcopal Church or to St. Mary's to attend the Forum. There is no Forum on Easter day.

## ANNUAL PRE-HOLY WEEK WORK DAY



Our annual work day to prepare our church buildings for Holy Week and Easter will be **Saturday, April 16**, beginning at **9:00 am**. Because of construction there is more than the usual amount of dust to be vanquished. There are jobs for every skill level. If you cannot come on Saturday there will be a work list available for tasks during the week. Doughnuts and coffee will be served.

## ANNUAL RENEWAL OF ORDINATION VOWS SERVICE

Each year the clergy of the diocese gather at the Cathedral during Holy Week to renew their ordination vows. This year the service will be **Tuesday, April 19, at 11:00 am**. Lay persons of the diocese are invited to attend to witness the renewal and as a sign of their support for the work of their clergy.

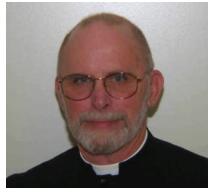
### BLESSED ARE THE GENEROUS

Opportunities for ministry abound! I'd like to draw your attention to but three of them so that you have ample time to add them to your calendars.

The first is the annual "*Measure of Faith*" food drive. St. Mary's has participated in this for the past few years and we do so again. It is a food drive to assist Manna Food Bank and the many agencies they support in our community. Many of the churches in our area collect food every Sunday during the month of April each year. In talking to the folks at Manna, they stressed to me the critical need present this year for a variety of reasons. They asked if we would commit to gathering 750 lbs. of non-perishable food during the month of April. So, please look for the list of needed items posted and bring what you can each Sunday.

*The second is the* Adopt-a-Street ministry with Temple Beth HaTaphila. That's where we pick up trash on MLK Blvd. throughout the year. Our next opportunity will be sometime in May. As soon as a definite Sunday afternoon is chosen, I'll let everyone know. It's very little work and a whole lot of fun.

The third is a totally new area of ministry for St. Mary's. Beginning the week of July 3-9 we will be partnering with St. Mark's Lutheran and Temple Beth HaTephila to host the shelter for women known as *Room In The Inn*. It is a ministry for 12 women provided on a weekly basis. Details of our first week are still being worked out. There is an organizational meeting at St. Mary's on **April 11, at 6:30**. Everyone is welcome to attend. More information will be forthcoming from *Michael Ashmore*, the St. Mary's liaison.

Opportunities for ministry do abound at St. Mary's - don't be bashful - be involved!

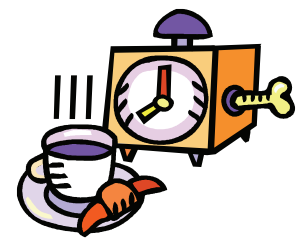
