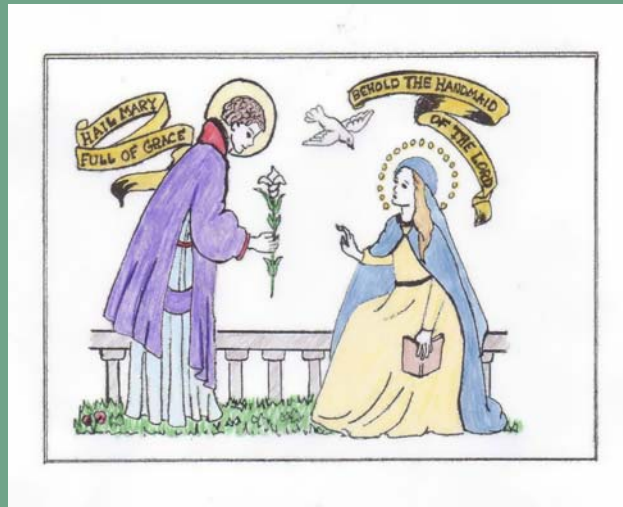

*Father Brent Norris*

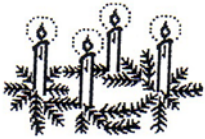

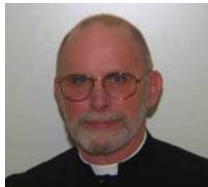

If any of you would like to have a very rewarding experience, I can tell you how to do that. And, it won't cost you anything other than a little of your time! When the volunteer sign-up sheets for Room In The Inn are posted, add your name to the list. For our second time, St. Mark's, Congregation Beth HaTephila, and St. Mary's will be hosting this movable shelter for homeless women. The dates are December 18 through December 24. That's right—the women will be with us on Christmas Eve and Christmas morning! Having worked at a shelter for several years, I can tell you, as you might well imagine, that the holidays can be a very troubling time for those who are homeless and away from their families. With your help, we can lessen that pain for this particular group of our sisters in need. The organizing committee from the three congregations has every intention of doing just that! "How," you ask? I've heard tell of things such as a manicurist and hair stylist offering their services to inviting the ladies to decorate a Christmas tree for our Parish Hall. The list of "things" is much longer than that. But, mostly it's about building relationships and just being there for them. And, oh yeh, the food is pretty good too! The women will once again be living at St. Mary's for that week so I ask you to include in your prayers a prayer for a speedy completion of the new parish hall! If you have any questions, need information, or already know that you want to help for a couple of hours, (or longer) please see *Michael Ashmore* or me. You will hear more about this as we get closer to that first Sunday evening with the ladies.

After having participated in this ministry in a small way last July, I can honestly tell you that you will receive so much more than you give.

## ROOM IN THE INN AT ST. MARY'S - DECEMBER 18-25

St. Mary's, along with St. Mark's Lutheran Church and Congregation Beth HaTephila, will be hosting **Room in the Inn** during the week before Christmas, ending Christmas morning. Starting Sunday evening (12/18) approximately twelve women will arrive at 6 pm, have dinner, spend the night, have breakfast, and leave with a sack lunch at 7 am the next morning. The three congregations take turns providing meals and spending the night. (If you'd like to help, please contact *Michael Ashmore* at 225-3202.) Even if you aren't volunteering, please join us for dinner at 6 pm - there's always plenty of food and conversation, and it's a friendly way to make our visitors feel welcome.

We'd like to make this a special week for the women, and we're planning some holiday activities in the evenings, such as cookie baking and decorating, tree trimming, haircuts and manicures, and movies. To make this happen we are collecting:

- holiday decorations (centerpieces for the tables, etc.)
- ornaments and lights
- ornament-making supplies (origami doves?, paper snowflakes?, paper chains?)
- cookie-decorating supplies (cookie cutters, cookie dough, tubes of icing, sprinkles)
- holiday DVDs and CDs
- we also need a Christmas tree!

**Gift bags** (approximately the size of a small shoe box) have been donated; now we need to fill them! A collection box with a gift bag sample will be placed in the narthex for donations, and/or you may contact *Jo Leichte*. Appropriate items include:

- candy, gum, snack foods
- pens & pencils
- journals, planners, stationery
- postage stamps
- bus passes (a ticket booklet of 11 rides is \$9; a monthly pass is \$20; both are available at the Asheville Transit Center, 49 Coxe Ave., next to the Post Office)

- nail polish, nail files, manicure sets
- shampoo, conditioner, body wash, body spray
- pill boxes
- to-go mugs
- umbrellas
