FROM THE RECTOR

Father Brent Norris

It has recently come to my attention that there is a conspiracy underway. A conspiracy I tell you. A plot that if successful will change this society. In a good way. For the past few years there has been an ecumenical, nationwide effort to de-commercialize Christmas and reclaim the spiritual grounding for the preparation and celebration of Our Savior's birth. Christmas has become something which is a religious observance only by accident.

So, the Advent Conspiracy was born as an effort to return to the real meaning and purpose of Christmas. The points of the Advent Conspiracy are as follows:

to worship more fully *to spend less*
give more thoughtfully *to love all.*

I want us to be a part of the Advent Conspiracy this year. Advent begins Sunday, November 28. To help us meet these objectives we have made the following plans.

To worship more fully we will join with our ecumenical partners in north Asheville for special services on Wednesdays during Advent. The first service will be on Thanksgiving Eve at St. Eugene Roman Catholic Church. The next week we will welcome our brothers and sister from St. Eugene, St. Mark's Lutheran and St. Paul's United Methodist to St. Mary's for Choral evensong. St. Mark's and St. Paul's will host the remaining weeks. Our time together will start with a simple meal, perhaps of soup and sandwiches after which we will gather for worship. In addition, St. Mary's will also be adding a quiet time of prayer and devotion before the Blessed Sacrament each Thursday from 5:30 pm until 6:30 pm.

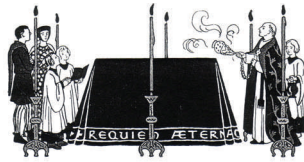
The goal of ***spending less*** asks that each of us look very intentionally at how and what we give as presents. Presents are nice, but often we get caught up in the commercial hype and believe that more is better. Make the choice and the agreement in your family and circle of friends to limit the amount you spend on each other. Thoughtful handmade gifts or coupons for services are better than another blue sweater.

To give more thoughtfully, our young adult group, St. Aelred's, is going to offer an Alternative Holiday Market during the Sundays of Advent. At the market you can make a gift in someone's name to Manna Food Bank or buy a goat for a village in Haiti. God's gift of Jesus to the world meant life to the world. What more fitting gifts can we give than those things that give life to those who live in want.

To love all, I am encouraging each of you to take the Advent season as a time to do two things. First, to make an intentional effort to repair that which has become broken or weak in your relationships with family and friends over the past year. Second, to make the conscious effort to reach out to someone who does not know the love of Jesus and invite them to be a part of worship in our community. That is a difficult thing for some of us to do. To help you reach out St. Mary's is providing simple business type cards with our service times and a welcome message. Please take some and look for times when you can simply hand them to someone.

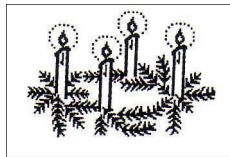

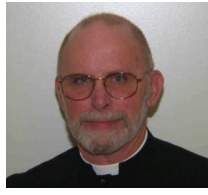

When I get the final numbers, I'll pass them along to you. But, the money that was raised will go a long way toward helping combat the effects of hunger around the world as well as in our own community. Thanks to all those who helped.

The second was our Adopt-a-Street cleanup of MLK Blvd. on October 17. Nine folks showed up on a sunny Sunday afternoon ready to work. And, you may rest assured, when they finished, MLK Blvd. was clean! I do, however, think it was a close contest between picking up trash, and talking and laughing among ourselves! I'm not sure which we did more of. I do know that it was great fun, and I look forward to our next time. Thanks to everyone.

The Social Justice committee of St. Mary's is currently exploring a project with Temple Beth HaTephela, the city, and others regarding homeless issues. The focus will center on mentoring once homeless folks who are now in housing for the first time in a long time. They need help so that they can maintain and stay in housing. As the details are worked out, I'll keep you informed. You may find that this could be an area of ministry that speaks to you. I hope so - because, much help is needed.

As your Deacon, I must tell you that it is gratifying to witness St. Mary's responding when presented with an opportunities for ministry. We are blessed.
